We began 2025 by celebrating the “quinceañero” of one of the girls living at Hogares Teresa Toda, an organization that provides a loving home and opportunities to girls facing difficult family situations. The party many young girls dream of became a reality thanks to the generosity of Liberty Puerto Rico colleagues from the Luquillo office, Liberty Business, VPTO, and Marketing. Together, they donated the dress, personal styling, photography, and decorations, and organized a heartfelt ceremony preceded by a Mass.

A home that transforms lives

From the age of nine, Hogares Teresa Toda became the home of Merlinda Millán Sánchez, after the Department of Family Services assumed legal custody to safeguard her physical and emotional well-being.

“At Hogares Teresa Toda, I first found safety, protection, and the love that every mother should instill in her daughters, along with all the tools and skills necessary to become who I am today: a professional woman with values that I can pass on to my daughter,” said Merlinda. “The most important things I received were emotional healing, a comprehensive education, and empowerment.”

Merlinda lived at Hogares Teresa Toda until age 18, after which she began a supervised independence process. She studied and now serves as an accounting assistant at the organization. Her gratitude is immense for the opportunity to give back to the girls who now walk the same path she once did.

Hogares Teresa Toda has received Liberty’s support for eight years, helping girls overcome experiences of abuse and/or neglect.

The potential of telecommunications



The telecommunications industry is constantly evolving, making it important for young people to understand its potential when choosing areas of academic interest. This was explained by Liberty Puerto Rico mobile network engineers Víctor Vera and Rayeq Badran during the second edition of “Careers with Purpose,” organized by Fundación Kinesis for high school students interested in technology careers.

Vera discussed engineering careers, where to study them in Puerto Rico, and specialties such as RF (radio frequency). Badran explained the wide range of roles within a leading telecommunications company like Liberty, from network design to its optimization and maintenance.

Liberty has partnered with Fundación Kinesis for six years to provide college scholarships.

Discovering the world of technology



Liberty Puerto Rico and Proyecto PECES established a partnership to introduce students from the organization's alternative school in Punta Santiago, Humacao, to careers related to telecommunications and broadband. Throughout the month of March, a total of 20 students visited six different work areas within the telecommunications company.

The students experienced firsthand advanced technology and high level of operational efficiency at Liberty's central offices in Guaynabo and Hato Rey. They also met with attorneys and other professionals from the legal division to learn about career opportunities within a highly regulated industry that serves the public interest as an essential service.

Additionally, they visited the Liberty store in Humacao, where they learned about sales and customer service, and one student spent several hours shadowing a field technician during residential service visits.



Plant nursery maintenance

Earth Month at Liberty is always marked by concrete actions taken by employees to help preserve and protect our islands' natural resources. The year 2025 was no exception, with 24 employees divided into four volunteer groups.

In Puerto Rico, we have partnered for eight years with Para la Naturaleza, supporting essential work across its protected areas. This year, volunteers assisted with nursery maintenance at the Río Piedras Botanical Garden, Las Cabezas de San Juan Nature Reserve in Fajardo, and Hacienda La Esperanza's orchard in Manatí.

Environmental education



Friends of the VI National Park works to preserve the U.S. Virgin Islands National Park in St. John, a mission that requires support beyond federal funding.

Our partnership of more than four years includes an annual grant to support Earth Day celebrations, an educational event attended by hundreds of students, as well as the help of Liberty VI volunteers, who play a vital role in ensuring the event's success.

For our children with cancer

Solidarity takes many forms, and one of the most meaningful for Liberty Puerto Rico colleagues is showing children with cancer at the University Pediatric Hospital that they are not alone. Each year, volunteers participate in Fundación CAP's main fundraising event by shaving their heads and donating funds so children can receive treatment without leaving Puerto Rico.

In 2025, Liberty amplified the campaign through public service announcements valued at \$80,000, raised \$1,500 in donations, and hosted an on-site merchandise sale.

Supporting entrepreneurs



One way we support nonprofits that promote entrepreneurship is by organizing markets where micro-entrepreneurs can sell their products. In collaboration with Professional Offices Park, owner and manager of Liberty's corporate headquarters, we hosted several such events throughout the year.

We began with the Eco-Friendly Market in April, featuring environmentally conscious products ranging from food and skincare items to plants, offered by entrepreneurs from Centro para Puerto Rico of the Sila M. Calderón Foundation.

In May, we organized the Mother's Market in partnership with Centro Paz Para Ti of Coordinadora Paz Para las Mujeres, an organization supported by Liberty for five years. Located in Adjuntas, the center provides psychosocial and support services in a region with limited access to opportunities.

Prior to Father's Day, we hosted another market featuring entrepreneurs from Centro para Puerto Rico as well as Liberty employees who own small businesses.

Students were encouraged to explore science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, essential disciplines for fostering creativity and innovation.

During her presentation, Liberty Foundation executive director Yadira Valdivia urged students to seize every opportunity they encounter to explore their interests and grow personally and academically.



Making music history



Make Music Happen celebrated 30 years of achievements of its Berklee in Puerto Rico program in two major ways. First, it successfully completed another edition of its intensive workshop, offering young musicians from across the island the opportunity to learn from top professors from the prestigious Berklee College of Music in Boston.

Second, the organization commemorated the milestone with a concert titled “30 Years of Magic,” featuring an outstanding musical showcase performed by program alumni. Once again, Make Music Happen demonstrated the many pathways to success made possible through this program, which has been supported by the Liberty Foundation for the past eight years.

Paving the way toward technology



As part of the final phase of the summer workshop “Environmental Ambassadors 4.0,” offered by the EcoExploratorio Science Museum of Puerto Rico in partnership with the Liberty Foundation, participants attended the forum “Women in Technology: Finding My Path.”

The event was held at Liberty Plaza and introduced young women to the wide range of professional opportunities available in the technology sector. During the week-long workshop, participants learned about scientific journalism, natural resources, climate change, and related topics.

This program aligns with EcoExploratorio’s mission to inspire individuals to explore, share, and protect the natural environment through science, engineering, mathematics, and technology.

Eradicating gender-based violence in the USVI



As part of our commitment to supporting nonprofit fundraising initiatives that make a difference in our communities, we sponsored the Women's Race organized by the Women's Coalition of St. Croix.

In addition, six Liberty VI volunteers were part of the team that donated their time to ensure the success of this large-scale event, which brought together 257 runners and walkers.

Women's Coalition of St. Croix provides prevention, education, and support services to survivors of gender-based violence, working to eradicate domestic and sexual violence in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Pride in connecting with our LGBTIQ+ community



Pride Month is not only a time to continue educating on issues affecting the LGBTIQ+ community, but also to demonstrate allyship through concrete actions.

Liberty Puerto Rico volunteers traveled to Jobos Beach to support the event "Live Your Pride, Isabela," organized by Waves Ahead. Volunteers collected trash along the popular beach and assisted with some of the event logistics. A donation was also made to support Waves Ahead's essential services for older LGBTIQ+ adults.

Another activity held during the month was an educational talk organized by Liberty's PRIDE ERG titled "Emotional resilience in challenging times." The presentation was delivered by social worker and case manager Shakira González of Waves Ahead, who has over 20 years of experience working directly with the LGBTIQ+ community.

As has become tradition, Liberty Puerto Rico volunteers visited the girls of Hogares Teresa Toda to celebrate the end of summer and prepare for the start of the 2025–26 school year.



Bingo for seniors

Liberty VI partnered with Lutheran Social Services of the VI to bring joy to seniors across the U.S. Virgin Islands. Volunteers organized lively bingo sessions complete with music, popcorn, sweets, and special surprises.

This initiative impacted more than 100 seniors across three centers: Yellow Cedar Home (Anna's Retreat), Ebenezer Gardens (Hospital Grounds), and Flamboyant Gardens (Barron Spot). The activity fostered joy, connection, and community support.



Clean beaches



Liberty Puerto Rico volunteers joined more than 7,000 people who answered the call of Scuba Dogs Society to collect thousands of pounds of trash from beaches, rivers, lakes, and green areas as part of the 40th International Coastal Cleanup.

Alongside Team Liberty, colleagues from Assurant also made a positive impact. Across the island, more than 58,000 pounds of waste were collected. “Thanks to your support, this collective effort goes beyond cleanup and becomes an educational and transformative movement for the benefit of our communities, Puerto Rico, and the planet,” Scuba Dogs Society stated in a thank-you letter regarding the cleanup at La Pocita Beach in Loíza, where Liberty volunteers helped collect 1,193.15 pounds of trash.

Young women coders

Young women who completed the fourth edition of the NextGen Tech Scholars program, offered by SOW Coders with support from the Liberty Foundation, received their certificates during a recognition event held at Liberty Plaza.

For 20 weeks, participants learned about the digital world, programming, and even the fundamentals of artificial intelligence. They celebrated their achievements alongside family members.

Additionally, six participants took part in a leadership workshop facilitated by Yamile Salas, the program coordinator.



Mentorship in STEM careers



Liberty Plaza hosted the Ingenius STEAM Café, an initiative designed to promote careers in science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics among middle and high school students through hands-on experiences with professionals in these fields.

Sponsored by the National Science Foundation and STEM Next Opportunity as part of the Teen Science Café Network, this marked the first time the program was held in Puerto Rico.
